

The readings for Easter 5B21

This year, the Gospel for the fifth Sunday of Easter is the first part of the True Vine discourse in John 15. To get to the deep meaning of passages in John, three steps are essential: (1) a close look at the Old Testament and early Jewish background; (2) an awareness of the links with the Jesus tradition in the Synoptic Gospels; (3) a reading of the imagery/vocabulary across the whole Gospel of John. All three are significant for the True Vine discourse, with
